Once you have earned an associate degree in one of the allied health fields offered at Hinds Community College, passed your requisite licensure, registration or certification exam, and been admitted into the degree program, you will be a junior at the University of Mississippi Medical Center and guaranteed access to the courses needed to earn your bachelor's degree.

Our program is designed so that academic course work completed during your time at Hinds Community College will plug right into our bachelor's degree program and let you stay on track.



What Degrees Are Offered?

The online Bachelor of Science in Health Sciences degree program is available to Hinds Community College allied health graduates through the **2+U** Program.

In addition, some allied health students may be eligible for the online Bachelor of Science degree programs in clinical laboratory science, health informatics and information management, or radiologic sciences.

What Are The Admission Requirements?

Your advisor at Hinds Community College and/or the advisor at the University of Mississippi Medical Center, School of Health Related Professions, can help you ensure that you are taking the right courses at Hinds Community College to qualify for admission at the University of Mississippi Medical Center.

The **2+U** Program at the University of Mississippi Medical Center is designed for students who:

- Have earned an associate degree in an allied health profession at Hinds Community College;
- Have passed an appropriate licensure, registration, or certification exam;
- Transfer to the University of Mississippi Medical Center in order to earn a bachelor's degree.

The program connects you with advisors early on so you take the right courses at the right time to expedite graduation.

Moreover, you are enabled to complete your bachelor's degree without leaving your home community. After earning your health care credential, you can become a member of the health care work force in your local area. At the same time you can complete all coursework for your bachelor's degree from your home by computer.

You will enrich your education and your work, as each will contribute insights to the other. Further, you will benefit from the experience of other students and health care professionals as you interact by computer in "virtual classrooms."

The program is designed for but not limited to, part time, nontraditional students.
