



2 Plus 2 Child Development Partnership

The following conditions specifically define the partnership/articulation agreement entered into by Delta State University (DSU), College of Education and Human Sciences, and Hinds Community College (HCC).

Hinds Community College Administrators/Faculty agree to provide the following:

- Recruitment (including promotion and marketing of the program) and identification of candidates for the Child Development Partnership (CDP)
- Advisement of prospective CDP candidates pursuant to prerequisites/guidelines established for the program and based upon the attached course of study (which indicates courses to be taken at HCC)
- Provision of course offerings at HCC that will enable students on track in the CDP to complete the 62 hours of identified coursework to be offered at HCC (see attached program of study)
- Consultation with the appointed HCC Coordinator and Administration/Faculty at DSU, College of Education and Human Sciences, regarding viability of the program, marketing, planning, and related items each semester and on an as-needed basis
- Facilitation of technology and media resources for students to collaborate with their professors

Delta State University Administrators/Faculty (College of Education and Human Sciences) agree to provide the following:


- Promotion/marketing of the CDP in the community-at-large and area schools
- Advisement of students who have met prerequisites for enrollment through study at HCC
- Coordination of program components to be offered through DSU (see attached program of study) at HCC
- Consultation with the appointed DSU Coordinator and Administration/Faculty at HCC regarding viability of the program, marketing, planning, and related items each semester and on an as-needed basis

Tuition will be assessed at DSU rates for DSU courses and HCC rates for HCC courses. DSU and HCC will work cooperatively to assist candidates with financial aid.


DSU agrees to provide the courses listed on the CDP program of studies each semester, provided approximately 15 students enroll. Students who enroll in the CDP are guaranteed the opportunity to complete the degree program through the CDP. However, those students must continuously enroll in four regular semesters in order to be guaranteed the opportunity to complete the degree program through the CDP.

CDP candidates must meet all requirements of the program for admission as outlined in the DSU Bulletin and maintain eligibility requirements to continue in the program.


This articulation agreement is in effect Fall Semester 2013. Our signatures below indicate acceptance and full support of this agreement.
