ACCOUNTING

National Society of Accountants (NSA) Scholarship Foundation: Forty (40) scholarships awarded per year in the amount of approximately \$1,000 each to accounting students entering their third or fourth year of studies, and approximately \$500 each to students entering their second year of studies. POLITICAL SCIENCE

Morris K. Udall Scholarship:

Awarded to undergraduates pursuing careers related to the environment, and to Native American and Alaska native students who intend to pursue careers in health care and tribal public policy. Awarded to sophomores or juniors from the two categories; awards are for one year and pay up to \$5,000. Scholars selected during their sophomore year may be re-nominated for a second year. Junior nominees may not be re-nominated. Candidates should be a sophomore or junior, have at least a "B" average, be a U.S. citizen or national, and be nominated by their college or university. Phi Theta Kappa All-USA Academic Team:

This program is sponsored by PTK, *USA Today*, and the American Association of Community Colleges. **A student does not have to be a member of PTK to apply.** Applicants must obtain the associate's degree during the current academic year, must have completed 12 semester hours (or quarter hours equivalent), and must have a 3.25 GPA on a 4.0 grading scale on all college credit course work completed. They must be nominated by the president of the college. Applications will be mailed to all college presidents by October 1 and must be RECEIVED at PTK Headquarters by

December 6. Applications may be obtained from the college president or may be downloaded from the PTK web site (ptk.org) using the access code provided to the college president.

Sixty winners are chosen which comprises three teams of twenty members each. (First, Second, and Third Teams). All winners receive a medallion and are featured in a full-page article in *USA TODAY* in April. The twenty First Team winners receive a \$2,500 scholarship. The All-USA and Guistwhite applications are identical. PTK members nominated to the All-USA Academic Team may be automatically considered for the Guistwhite Scholarships by completing one additional form included in the All-USA application.

Phi Theta Kappa (The Guistwhite Scholar Program): Provides twenty (20) \$5,000 scholarships to PTK members for completion of their baccalaureate degrees. Ten Guistwhite Scholars receive \$5,000 each and ten Guistwhite Finalists receive \$1,000 each to be used to obtain a baccalaureate degree. Applicants must be an active member of PTK, must obtain his/her associate's degree during the current academic year, must post a 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 grading scale on all college credit course work completed, and must at the time of transfer, be admitted with junior-level status and enroll in a minimum of six credit hours per semester at the senior college/university in order to receive the first scholarship stipend.

Applications will be available on October 1 and must be RECEIVED at PTK headquarters by the first week in December. Applications may be obtained in three ways: downloaded from the PTK web site (ptk.org), fax from (601) 984-3548, or by calling PTK headquarters at (601) 957-2241, ext. 566 and requesting a copy. All Guistwhite winners will have their names posted on the PTK web site and will be recognized on stage at a General Session at the PTK International Convention.

The Guistwhite and the All-USA applications are identical. Phi Theta Kappa members nominated for the Guistwhite Scholarship may be automatically considered for the All-USA Academic Team by completing one additional form included in the All-USA application.

Phi Theta Kappa Leaders of Promise Scholarship:

Thirty \$1,000 scholarships awarded annually for PTK members for completion of associate degree course work at their two-year college. The award is disbursed in two equal payments of \$500 per semester. The first payment will be made once the student provides documentation of enrolling in a minimum of six semester credit hours at the community college. The second stipend will be paid once the student provides documentation of enrolling in a minimum of six semester credit hours, has successfully maintained a 3.25 cumulative grade point average and has met minimum participation requirements in his/her PTK chapter as outlined in the *Participation Requirement Form*.

Bottom Line: applicable to 2nd semester-Freshmen who secured PTK membership in the fall.

Phi Theta Kappa members in good standing, and currently enrolled in a community college at the time of application, may apply for the \$500 cash stipend. Part-time, full-time, and international students must post a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA (out of possible 4.0) on all associate degree coursework at the time of application. Students who have completed 36 semester hours **or less** by January 31 are eligible to apply. Students must NOT hold an Associate's degree or Bachelor's degree from any community college or senior institution.

Materials CANNOT be submitted by fax or email. All forms must be typed. Do not attach resume or additional material. Incomplete applications will be deemed ineligible.

The annually renewable award amount will be variable up to a maximum of \$30,000 annually to fund tuition and fees for the remainder of the scholar's undergraduate degree program, as long as the scholar continues to meet the eligibility requirements.* Scholarship monies not used during one academic year are not transferable to the succeeding academic year. The number of scholarships awarded will depend on the number and qualifications of the nominees. All candidates must be nominated by their community college. (Dual enrolled / home-schooled students are eligible to apply.

*Eligibility conditions: attending a fully licensed and/or accredited community college; completed freshman year credits at the time of nomination; demonstrate strong academic achievement (target cumulative GPA: 3.3 and above on a 4.0 scale); be transferring to an accredited 4-year institution.

Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant (MTAG): A maximum \$500 award for freshmen/sophomores and \$1,000 for juniors/seniors per academic year. MTAG awards are available until the time required to complete the requirements for one certificate, one associate or bachelor's degree not to exceed ten semesters of full-time enrollment. Students who are eligible for a full Federal PELL Grant are NOT eligible for MTAG funds. Students who are eligible for a partial PELL Grant may receive MTAG funds for an amount that when combined with the PELL Grant does not exceed the amount of a full PELL Grant. The amount of annual awards is based on the availability of funds and is subject to prorating. Application deadline is September 15. Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant (MTAG): A maximum \$2,500 award per academic year for a first-time entering freshman who has a minimum 3.5 GPA calculated on a 4.0 scale and a minimum National Act score of 29.
