NOTES:

Before being admitted to the Teacher Education Program, the student must have at least a 2.5 GPA on required courses and make a passing score on the PRAXIS Examination. Registration packets for this test are available from ETS.org/PRAXIS and in the Counseling Department on the Raymond Campus. Effective Fall 1996, the State Board of Education approved an exemption to the PRAXIS for any student who had an ACT composite score of 21 (SAT equivalent of 860) with no sub-score below 18 upon his/her **initial** entrance into college. A student who has earned **any** college credit before taking the ACT does **not** qualify for this exemption. Students should take the PRAXIS during the fall of their sophomore year. The DSU School of Education offers a departmental scholarship to **one** Hinds transfer student majoring in elementary education. Consult with one of your instructors to secure that recommendation.
