2. Elementary education majors must now select one or more specialty (concentration) areas to emphasize. These areas may be selected from the student's choice of major teaching areas: Ex. English, History, Math, Science, etc. The 6 hours of concentration electives should come from these areas. The courses chosen must be above those required in the core program.

All students seeking admission to the School of Education must take and pass the PRAXIS Examination. Effective Fall 1996, the State Board of Education approved an exemption to the PRAXIS Examination for any student who had an ACT composite score of 21 (SAT equivalent of 860) with no sub-score below 18 UPON HIS/HER INITIAL ENTRANCE INTO COLLEGE. A student who has earned any college credit before taking the ACT does not qualify for this exemption.
