**NOTES:**

A grade of at least "C" must be earned in every course in the pre-pharmacy curriculum. NO "D's" WILL TRANSFER. Students must maintain a minimum 2.75 GPA on all required pre-pharmacy courses, excluding humanities, social sciences, and fine arts courses. Few students are admitted with this average, however. **No credit is given for science courses earned through Advanced Placement (AP) or CLEP examinations.**

Students must apply to the School of Pharmacy **and** take the Pharmacy College Aptitude Test (PCAT) **by February 1** of the year in which they plan to enter pharmacy school, and they **must have all pre-pharmacy requirements completed by May**. The PCAT is given 3 times per year, usually Oct/Nov, Jan/Feb, and May/June. The score on the PCAT must be on a test taken no more than 12 months prior to the application deadline.
