If a combined course in Algebra & Trigonometry is taken, then the student must take Calculus I in order to satisfy the 6 hour mathematics requirement. Students **beginning** their math studies at the Calculus I level may satisfy UMC's math requirement upon completion of that course. Students may have to take courses at higher levels than those required by UMC in order to complete degree requirements at their respective undergraduate colleges or universities as these requirements are generic to the University of Mississippi Medical Center. Student should consult the catalog or university to determine specific courses in their major at that school. Students may choose **any** major and seek enrollment into medical or dental school; however, regardless of the chosen major, the science and math courses listed above are required for entry into both the medical and dental programs.

All required courses must have a college grade; therefore, advanced placement (AP) credit and CLEP credit CANNOT meet these requirements. An applicant who has AP credit or CLEP credit for any of the required courses can take higher level classes in that subject for a grade in order to fulfill the requirement. No grade below "C" will count in these majors; however, students should strive for a much higher grade point average if they wish to be a serious candidate for medical or dental school.
