1. Consult the Department of Elementary Education in the USM *Catalog* to determine which courses may be utilized toward the areas of endorsement. Endorsement areas which may be started at Hinds are English Language, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Mathematics, and Science. Other endorsements which would have to be started at USM include Reading, Special Education, and Gifted Education. NOTE: It is **strongly recommended** that students take and pass the PRAXIS I Examination before being admitted to the Teacher Education Program. Application packets for this test are available in the Counseling Departments. Effective Fall 1996, the State Board of Education approved an exemption to the PRAXIS for any student who had an ACT composite score of 21 (SAT equivalent of 860) with no sub-score below 18 upon his /her initial entrance into college. A student who has earned any college credit before taking the Act does *not* qualify for this exemption. A minimum GPA of 2.65 is required for admission to the Teacher Education Program.
